Activity 28.1: Read the conversation. Take roles and practise.

Customer: I'm sorry to say this, manager. Almost for half-an-hour I've been waiting to get money for my cheque.

Manager: Please bear with us. See, it's all due to network failure. Not just here, all over

the country.

Activity 28.2: Take roles and practise.

1. Suppose your father asks you to go and call the doctor, and you are busy with your project, so you decide to complain to your mother. Make up the dialogue and practice.
